First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas The Minutes for the Stated Meeting of the Session Tuesday, October 7, 2025, 6:00 p.m.

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas, met for its monthly Stated meeting on Tuesday, October 7, 2025.

The following members were present: Elder Jodie Arnold, Elder Travis Arnold, Elder and Clerk Paula Boaz, Elder Martine Boumtje, Elder Cathy Downs, Elder and Treasurer Kathy Gean, Elder Ashley Hagaman, Elder Sue Joyce, and Elder Chris White.
Call to order: Pastor Ray Durham called the meeting to order, declared a quorum present, and opened the meeting with prayer at 6:00 p.m.

Devotional: Elder Paula Boaz gave the devotional on "The Power of Prayer", describing the many different kinds of prayer and ways prayer helps God's followers.

Youth and Family Ministries: Elder Jodie Arnold reported that the youth program "Fields of Faith" will be at Panther Stadium on Wednesday, October 8th. The Mission committee is a sponsor and has donated money for our youth to attend. October 22nd there will be a church Halloween event. She reported that between 8-10 kids age K-6 grade are attending the Wednesday night program, and there are 8-10 smaller kids attending weekly. They are learning to sing with their pianist, Mary Plunkett. Plans for a guitarist did not work out. Lee West is one of the teachers.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer and Elder Kathy Gean reported that there was nothing out of the ordinary and that Amanda Baker had completed the church's financial audit. A copy of Amanda Baker's audit letter was distributed. Kathy discussed SAU's plan to pack Christmas Boxes for Samantha's purse. Following discussion, it was decided that church volunteers would help with this project.

Approval of August Minutes: The Session reviewed the August Minutes. Elder Ashley Hagaman moved to approve. Elder Jodie Arnold seconded, and Session approved accordingly.

Correspondence and Requests: Thank you notes were received from Susan Reddell, Magnolia Junior High School football team, the SAU Choir and Jamesiee (student who the Mission committee helped with obtaining a school instrument).

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Administrative—Elder Chris White reported on a temporary issue with the gas (Summit) supply to the church. Chris announced that the Church's annual Pledge drive would begin soon. He encouraged everyone to return their pledge cards as soon as possible. 2026 Budget worksheets were distributed to each committee.

Christian Education—Cathy Downs and Jodie Arnold reported that a Young Adult Sunday School class is starting.

Fellowship—Elder Ashley Hagaman reported that the Youth will assist at the Stewpot on October 14th. She also reported that the 9th grade Academy is requesting help with obtaining "joggers" for students. Anita Moore will shop for these. Mission/Evangelism—Elder Kathy Gean reported that the committee served the August and September SCM meals and served the SAU band in Fellowship Hall on August 11th. The committee will have the November Wednesday meals for shut-ins.

Worship—Elder Sue Joyce stated that she, Dr. Dan Dykema and Elder Martine Boumtje met and worked on improving the Communion service procedures. Dr. Dykema reported that the acoustic guitarist he had contacted will be available as his full-time job allows. Elder Sue announced that following some technical adjustments, the quality of the church's streaming services has greatly improved.

Young Adult Outreach—Elder Travis Arnold reported that their group had recently won third place in Mulekick's trivia night contest. Travis announced that our church will sponsor the Chamber of Commerce's "Christ in Christmas" theme. Pumpkins will be available for families to participate in carving contests on October 22nd. Travis discussed how the Minden church live-streams their Sunday service and how we could purchase an i-Pad and live-stream our services.

New Business:

a.Elder Martine Boumtje reported on the Presbytery meeting in Jackson Mississippi. Several items were announced and discussed: our church was requested to send an additional RE commissioner to the meetings, Elders were encouraged to volunteer to serve on Presbytery Committees, the Gulf South Presbytery proposed 2026 budget, and a Round-Up Newsletter of the Stated meeting on September 26-27, 2025

b. Early discussion of our Church hosting a future Presbytery Quarterly meeting.

c.Elder Martine discussed the EPC World Outreach workers program and the new persons who have to learn the local language prior to going over-seas. Martine moved to send \$500 to each of the three missionaries to assist in financing their language studies. Elder Paula Boaz seconded and Session approved.

d.Financial reports: a 2024 summary report of money spent externally on missions and community needs including Mission Committee, Investment Committee, Mentorship, Cameroon, Church Education, Evangelism, and other Session approved expenditures for a total of \$139,868.71. A similar report for January 2025 through September 2025 including Mission Committee, Investment Committee, Mentorship, Cameroon, Outreach Committee, and other Session approved expenditures for a total of \$148,089.50.

OLD Business

- a. Committee report on possible property purchase. Elder Chris White reported that there is no movement yet on the property as an offer has been made by another party.
- b. Audit letter (discussed under Treasurer's report)

Adjournment and Prayer

There being no Further Business, Elder Sue Joyce recommended that Session close the meeting, Elder Jodie Arnold seconded, and Rev. Durham closed the meeting with Prayer at 7:25 PM.
