



> First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas The Minutes for the Stated Meeting of the Session Tuesday, March 28, 2023, 6:00 p.m.

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas met for its monthly stated meeting on Tuesday, March 28, 2023. The following members were present, Moderator Dr. Pierre Boumtje, Elder Debbie Arnold, Elder Jodie Arnold, Elder Mary Bounds, Elder Kathy Gean, Elder Ashley Hagaman, Elder Mike McNeill, Elder Anita Moore, Elder Blake Pierce, and Elder Ryan Phillips. Elder Dr. Dan Dykema had an excused absence. Also present were Paula Boaz (Clerk), and Youth Director Katherine Phillips.

Call to order: Moderator Pierre Boumtje called the meeting to order, declared a guorum present, and opened the meeting with prayer at 6:00 pm.

Session Devotional: Elder Anita Moore gave the devotional from the Book of Esther in the Old Testament. Queen Esther was one of the strongest women in history and saved the Jewish people. We need to ask God to help us to re-order our brains and lives and lean on him.

Youth and Family Ministries Director's Report: Katherine Phillips reported that the Youth groups are going well. She plans to gather information from the Youth on what they would like to study and activities they would like to do, etc. She has purchased supplies for VBS.

Treasurer's Report: Elder and Treasurer, Kathy Gean, reported that there was nothing new for the financial report. Elder Mary Bounds moved to accept the report as information. Elder Mike McNeill seconded, and Session voted accordingly.

Approval of the minutes: Elder Mike McNeill moved to accept the February Minutes, Elder Mary Bounds seconded, and Session approved.

Correspondence and requests:

A request was received from ISI for funds to assist their mission. A decision was made to take no action.

A request from the Columbia County Living (publication) to participate in their history book project by paying for a full-page ad at \$125.00 was reviewed. Elder Ashley Hagaman moved to approve this expenditure. Elder Jodie Arnold seconded, and Session approved.

Elder Anita Moore brought a request from Gideons International to speak to our congregation at a Sunday Service. Elder Anita Moore moved to allow. Elder Mary Bounds seconded and Session approved.

A request was received from the Arkansas Department of Health for hygiene items for foster children in Columbia County. Youth Director, Katherine Phillips, volunteered to have the Youth in VBS collect these items.

Committee Reports:

Administrative— Elder Blake Pierce reported that the new Sanctuary air conditioner is currently being installed. He continues to deal with the water problem beneath the Sanctuary. Youth Director, Katherine Phillips, requested that the old railroad ties be removed as some of them have termites. Blake will arrange to have them removed.

Cameroon—No report, but everyone was reminded to donated gently used clothing for Cameroon this summer.

Discipleship— Elder Mary Bounds announced that the Confirmation service will be on Palm Sunday. They have studied the symbolism of the season of Lent. Plans are in the works for Bible School, Kavanna Jones has been hired to assist with the after-school program.

Fellowship— Elder Anita Moore reported that her committee continues to assist with the Stewpot. Her committee will be cooking the Wednesday night fellowship for the end of school year event.

Mission/Evangelism — Elder Debbie Arnold reported that her committee continues to provide a monthly meal for the Southern

Worship— Elder Mike McNeil reported that pulpit supply is filled through June.

Old Business:

The following members have volunteered to serve on the Special Events committee: Paula Smith, Jodie Arnold, Kathy Gean, Tracy Johnson, and Matthew DeSeguirant.

The per capita for the Presbytery has been paid for 2022, but not for 2023. It was suggested that we wait until the vote at the Congregational meeting on April 16th to see if the Presbytery of the Pines requested any monetary payments.

New Business:

Elder Ryan Phillips discussed the format for the April 16th Congregational meeting.

Elder Anita Moore stated that we need input on exactly what we want as an interim pastor. It was expressed it needs to be someone who can provide pastoral care for the congregation.

The Session was reminded that Moderator Pierre Boumtje will be out of the country in June and July. We will need someone who can act as Session Moderator and Serve the Sacraments.

First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas The Minutes for the Called Congregational Meeting Sunday, April 16, 2023, 11:00 A.M.

Immediately following the Service on Sunday, April 16, 2023, Dr. Pierre Boumtje, Moderator of the Session, called for a Congregational Meeting and declared a Quorum present. Dr. George Wortham, interim Director of the Presbytery of the Pines explained his agenda and objectives for the meeting. Dr. Wortham further stated that the congregation would not be voting, but rather the Presbytery would be taking a Poll from each member present. Those members not present would be contacted via phone by the Presbytery.

Following these comments there were questions from Elder Ryan Phillips regarding this church's status as a legally incorporated entity. Dr. Wortham insisted that this church could not make the decision to transfer from PCUSA, but rather, the decision would be made by the Presbytery if it would allow this church to transfer to another entity.

Dr. Wortham then presented three legal pads which were labeled LEAVE (to leave PCUSA), NO OPINION (to abstain), STAY (to remain in PCUSA). He then directed the Congregation members to sign one of the pads as they exited the Sanctuary.
