
## **Lincoln Curtis Nelson**





### First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas The Minutes for the Stated Meeting of the Session Tuesday, August 22, 2023, 6:00 p.m.

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Magnolia, Arkansas met for its monthly stated meeting on Tuesday, August 22, 2023. The following members were present, Moderator Dr. Pierre Boumtje, Elder Jodie Arnold, Elder Mary Bounds, Elder Dr. Dan Dykema, Elder Kathy Gean, Elder Mike McNeill, Elder Blake Pierce, and Elder Ryan Phillips. Elders Debbie Arnold, Ashley Hagaman, Anita Moore, and Youth Director Katherine Phillips had excused absences. Paula Boaz, Clerk was also present.

**Call to order:** Moderator Pierre Boumtje called the meeting to order, declared a quorum present, and opened the meeting with prayer at 6:00 p.m.

Session Devotional: Elder Kathy Gean presented a devotional.

**Treasurer's Report:** Elder and Treasurer Kathy Gean discussed the various financial reports and asked for questions. There being no questions, the report was accepted as information.

Youth report: The youth report will be incorporated in the Discipleship report.

Approval of May Minutes: The May Minutes were corrected to reflect that Dr. Dan Dykema presented the May Devotional.

**Correspondence and Requests:** The church has received a letter concerning repairs for the organ. Organist Elizabeth Davis and Elder Dan Dykema will investigate the needed repairs, possible costs, available companies and plan accordingly.

#### **Committee Reports**

Administrative: Elder Blake Pierce reported that he has been in discussions with Bensberg Sound of Camden concerning the church's sound systems. Bensberg recommends that we replace the old sound system with all new digital equipment. Following discussion, Elder Mike McNeill recommended that Blake plan with Bensberg for the replacements and spend up to \$25,000. Elder Ryan Phillips seconded and Session unanimously approved.

**EPC report:** A call from Bruce Rux of EPC was received by the Clerk offering the option of waiting until late January to attend the EPC meeting in Monroe rather than September in Houston. Following discussion, the entire Session agreed that they prefer to attend the Houston EPC meeting. Materials for the Houston meeting will be distributed in early September. The Session recommended that Elder Dr. Dan Dykema and Clerk Paula Boaz attend the September meeting in Houston and that the church pay all expenses for travel and attendance.

Cameroon: Elder Pierre Boumtje reported that Solar Panels were installed to provide electricity for the church in Cameroon.

**Discipleship:** Elder Mary Bounds announced that the Discipleship Committee will sponsor a Breakfast and an after-church potluck dinner the first Sunday following Labor Day which will be September 10<sup>th</sup>. Ladies' Circle will meet on September 11<sup>th</sup>.

Worship: Elder Mike McNeill reported that Rev. Ray Durham will preach and do Communion on the first Sunday in September.
